Guinea:

There are confirmed cases of Ebola in the country and National State of Emergency has been declared. Health checks to be carried out on all persons and no disembarkation of non-Guinea stowaways.

According to latest update available, 5 new cases have been confirmed in the infected areas since our last update, bringing the total to 683 confirmed cases in Guinea since the beginning of the outbreak, among which 410 fatalities. Again, such organizations as Doctors Without Boundaries (MSF) however recommend to remain vigilant as they suspect some infected persons remain hidden by fear of stigmatization amongst their community (rather than declaring themselves and asking for treatment) and could potentially contaminate more.

Inland borders with Liberia, Sierra Leone, Ivory Coast, Guinea Bissau and Senegal are officially closed.

Port of CONAKRY:

Two circulars have been issued by the Conakry Port Authorities (below links), confirming the following measures have been implemented:

- ➤ Shore personnel attending onboard to be reduced to strict minimum
- Anyone attending ship (pilot, agent, stevedores, ...) to wear disposable gloves and mask at all times
- Compulsory use of sanitizer/bleach before boarding vessel
- Avoid physical contact with outsiders attending onboard
- Medical screening and body temperature monitoring of port personnel, workers and agents
- > ALL crew to remain onboard during call
- Certificate to be issued by local Health Authorities to the ship when leaving port
